Days Observed

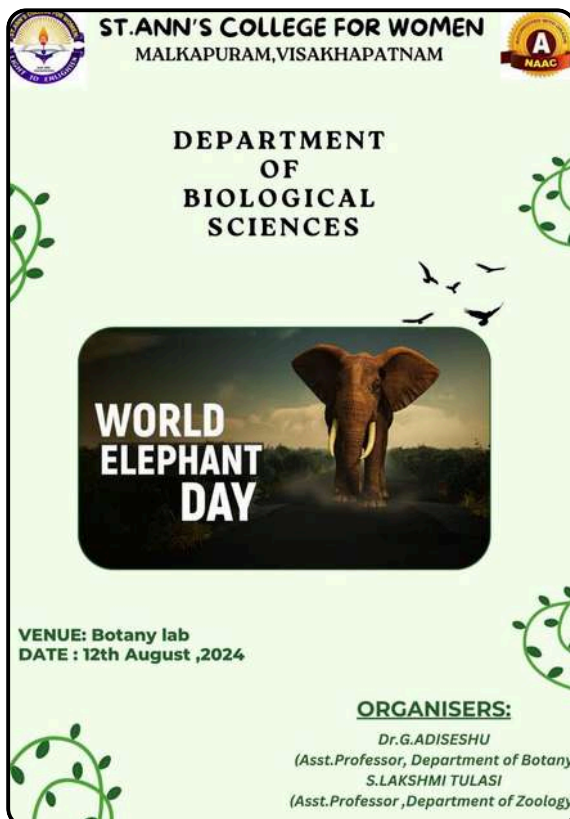
• International Youth Day

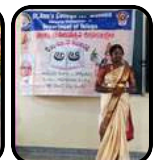
Telugu Basha Dinotsavam

The **Department of Telugu** organized **Telugu Basha Dinotsavam** celebrations with a series of lively events from **August 22th to August 29th**.

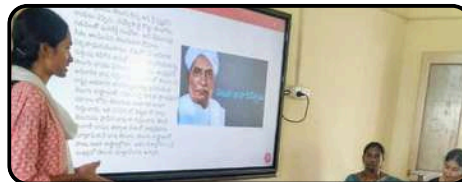

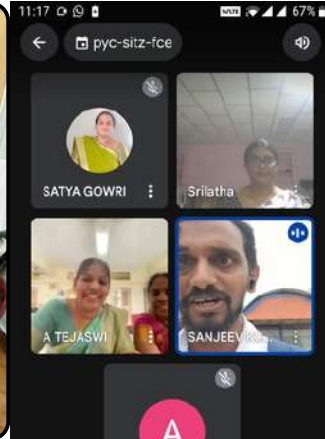


• National Handloom Day
