#### STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURES

#### 1. Academic calendar

With reference to academic calendar exams are planned.

#### 2. Formation of Exam Committee

Members for exam committee are selected by the management.

#### 3. Planning

The committee meets the Principal and plans for the forth coming exams.

#### 4. Circular

A Circular to all staff members is sent mentioning the dates and subjects with time and session.

The circular requests for question paper and answer key.

The same is followed by each department and they in turn frame and submit the individual timetable to the COE which is displayed on the notice boards.

#### **5. Question Papers Setting:**

The respective subject teachers set their Question Papers and will submit the same to the CoE along with the answer key.

Preparation of Question Paper is as per university regulations.

#### 6. Requirements

Arrangements are made demanding to the number of required copies of question paper.

All the necessary steps are taken to print the question paper.

Arrangements of answer scripts, accounts sheets, graph sheet, thread were made.

#### 7. Rooms identification and intimation to All HoDs & In-charges

Identifying the examination halls and intimation to the Manager is made for necessary arrangements.

Preparation of consolidated seating plan and attendance sheets.

Students will be intimidated the same on the previous day of the examinations through different notice boards and entry points near steps.

Request for security persons to control the flow and to support the examination system.

#### 8. Allotment of Dept. Wise Invigilators

Invigilators are selected based on the need and are intimidated.

No of invigilators = total strength / 30 per internal examinations

#### 9. Class room boards cleaning

The class room board cleaning duty is assigned to Non-Teaching staff.

#### 10. Distribution of Question Papers to halls

The invigilators on the day of Examination carry question papers along with them to the examination hall.

#### 11. Attendance sheet

Attendance sheet statements are arranged on the daily basis.

It will be taken by the invigilators to the exam halls along with the question paper cover.

#### 12. Bell timings

- a. Short Bell at 8.45AM / 12.30 PM
- b. Medium Bell at 9:00AM / 12.45 PM
- c. Long Bell at 9.15 AM / 1:00 PM
- d. Warning Bell at 12:25 PM / 3.55 PM
- e. Final Bell at 12.15:00 PM / 4:00 PM

#### 13. Absentees Statements for all examinations

A notebook is circulated to all the rooms to get information of the strength of the students.

After every examination, branch wise consolidated absentee's statement is prepared.

#### 14. Collection and Submission of answer scripts from invigilators to Subject Teachers

Branch wise answer scripts will be collected from invigilators.

The same will be handed over to the respective subject teachers.

#### 15. Evaluation & Submission

Collection of the marks statements from the subject teachers.

Absentees should be marked with separate ink.

Entering the same data in CMS.

Maintaining all the acknowledgements of uploading data.


Consolidated Branch wise marks collected from each department.

#### BRIEF HISTORY

St. Ann's College was started as a Junior College in 1976 Aug. 2nd, in the land donated by the Caltex Oil Refinery. It was started with 28 students and 9 staff members on its roll, to provide education to the girls of Industrial area of Malkapuram and near by villages and also to the girls coming from the remote villages of A.P.

In the first year the classes were conducted in St. Joseph's School which is run by the same management Sr. Rosy Paul, M.A., B.Ed, was the first Principal and nine staff members were selected.

When the construction of the building was completed in July 1977, classes were shifted to this clean and green campus. Sr. Immaculate, M.Sc., B.Ed., took overcharge as Principal from the same year. In 1978 hostel was started for the girls who came from far away places. M.P.C. was added to the existing group in 1980. Our college was admitted into grant-in-aid in the same year.

In 1987 Sr. Immaculate was transferred to Vijayawada as she was elected as the Assistant Provincial and Sr. Tresa Mary, M.A., B.Ed., was appointed as Principal. In 1988 Vocational Course was added to the existing three groups. This course has helped our students to take up jobs immediately after the completion of their intermediate. Those who got good percentage have gone for B.Sc. Nursing and General Nursing.

With the phenomenal expansion of Visakhapatnam city the population is growing at very high rate and the existing college are not able to provide facilities to all the students who want to pursue degree courses, especially for women. From this point of view the proposal of the Management to start degree college for women, in the premises of St. Ann's Junior College was sanctioned with the effect from the academic year 1991 -92.



The college is located in an area of 7 acres. With total area of 29,307 Sqft.

In order to help our degree students to have better job opportunities computer course was introduced in the year 1993 - 94. Along with the degree they are completing PGDCA and are given certificates which have enabled many students to take up job in Computer field. The first batch of degree students brought laurels to our institution by their activities.

After upgrading the College, the first floor was constructed with all the necessary labs for the Degree. Today we have 1,500 students, 60 teaching staff and 20 supportive staff.


The Pioneers especially the Principals laid a very good foundation to the standards of the Institution. Rev. Sr. Immaculate, the first Principal after her 20 years of valuable service as Superior General came back to college as the Correspondent with the effect from July 3rd 2007. Sr. Tresa Mary having rendered her valuable service to the college for 32 years retired and transferred. Later we had Sr. Belsy and Sr. Christy as Principals. At present we have separate principals for both Inter and Degree. Sr. Prema, Principal of the St. Ann's Degree College and Sr. Janice, Principal of St. Ann's Junior College.

#### GENERAL REGULATIONS

Through their applications, the students enter voluntarily into an agreement to abide by the rules and regulations of the College. Hence each student accepts the responsibility to uphold the standards of the College whether on or off the campus. Bearing in mind that the actions of any member of the community affect directly or indirectly all the other members, the College expects its members to observe the rules & regulations as set forth in the handbook.

- The day begins with a common morning prayer at 8.50 a.m. in which all participate.
- The College expects the students to be punctual and regular in attendance for all classes. They are in their class rooms at the first bell which goes 10 minutes before the commencement of the morning/evening sessions.
- A day's attendance requires present at all lectures of both sessions.
- The absentees get prior premission from the Principal. Both the hostel and day students notify their absence from lectures to the Principal through leave notes. Absence without leave notes is subject to penalty.
- Students who require permission for leave from a lecture hour obtain it from the concerned lecturer before the lecture hour.
- 6. Students who require leave for a whole session obtain it from the Principal through a written leave letter.
- Students who absent themselves without the above proper premissions, disciplaniry action is taken at the discretion of the Principal.
- 8. Students are to have 75% of the total attendance fixed for each course.
- Students do not leave the college premises during sessions without the permission of the Principal.



- 10. Students spend their free hours in library and study.
- 11. The day students do not enter the hostel quarters.
- 12. Prior permission of the Principal is essential to hold any meeting or gathering in the college premises.
- No books, magazines or newspapers which are in no way related to the classes/studies are brought into the campus.
- 14. Letters addressed to students in the college are subject to scrutiny by the Principal.
- 15. No collection/subscription of any kind is allowed without the knowledge and consent of the Principal.
- Change of residence/address of the students is notified to the Principal & office without delay.
- 17. Students of St. Ann's are to be extra courteous, sensitive, alert, service minded, polite and lady-like in their behaviour.
- Short sleeves, low necklines, high blouses and low hips are not permited.
- 19. Students shall wear mask, carry hand sanitizer along with them and maintain social distance.
- Students are to be strictly attend to the college in their uniform with I.D. Cards.
