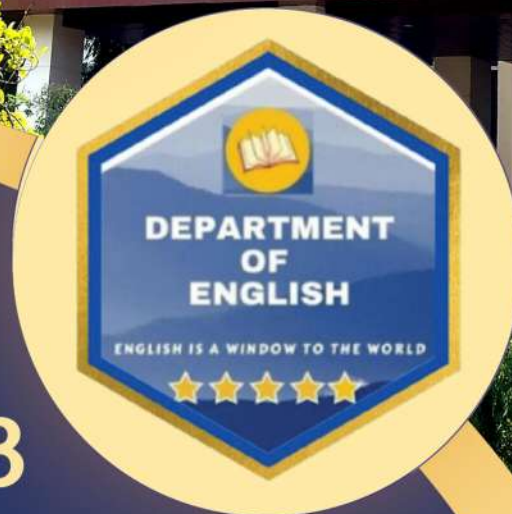

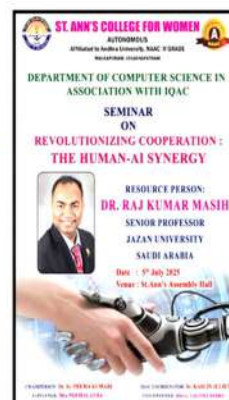
SEMINAR/CONFERENCE/WORKSHOP

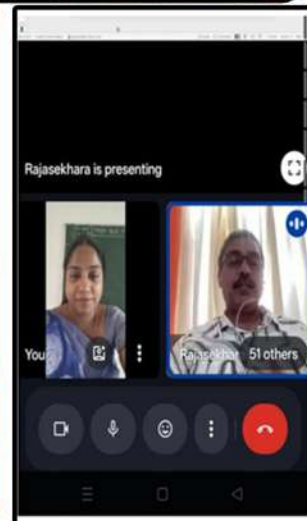

Gardeners Mega Meet

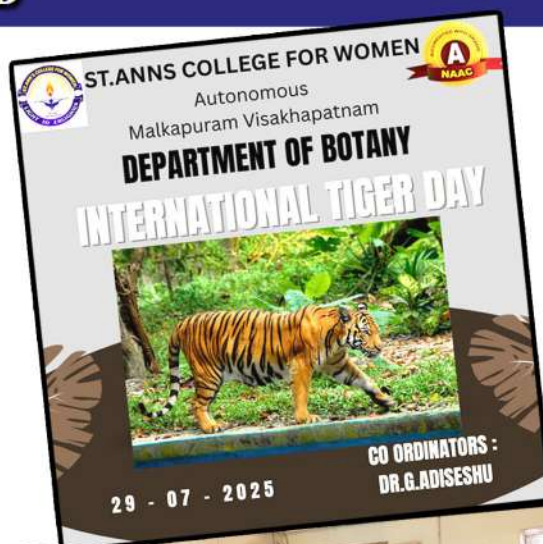

World Nature Conservation Day

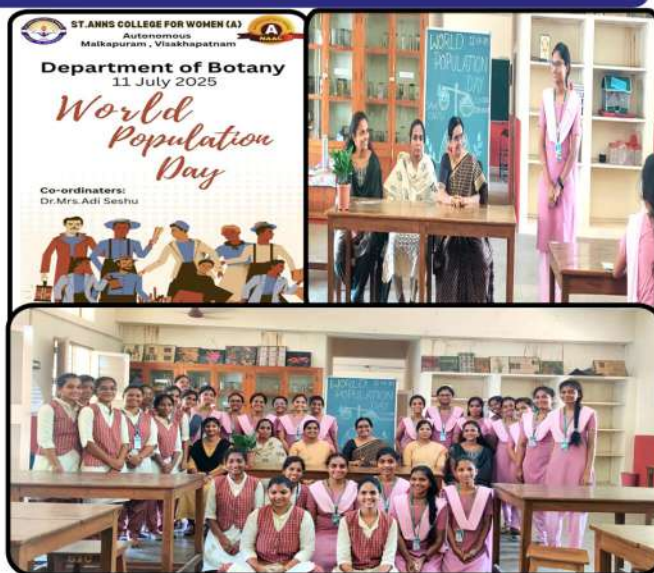

Plastic Bag Free Challenge: Telugu Department Leads the Way

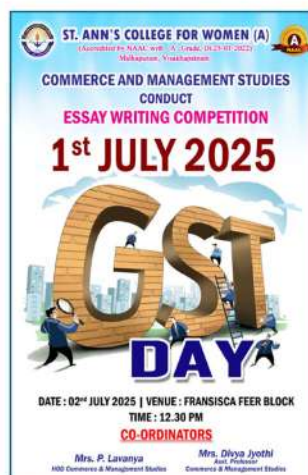

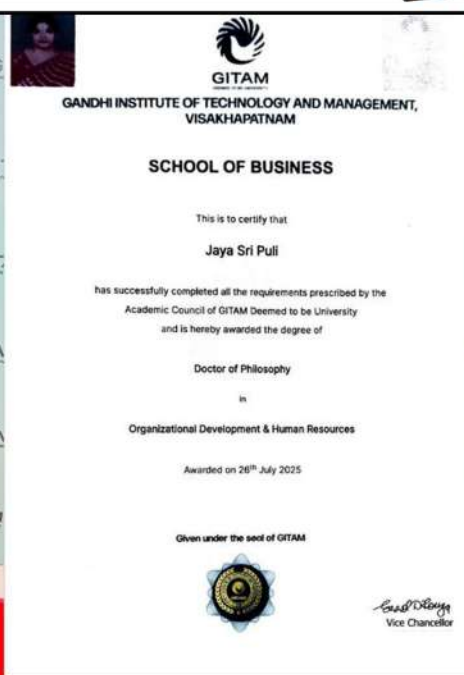
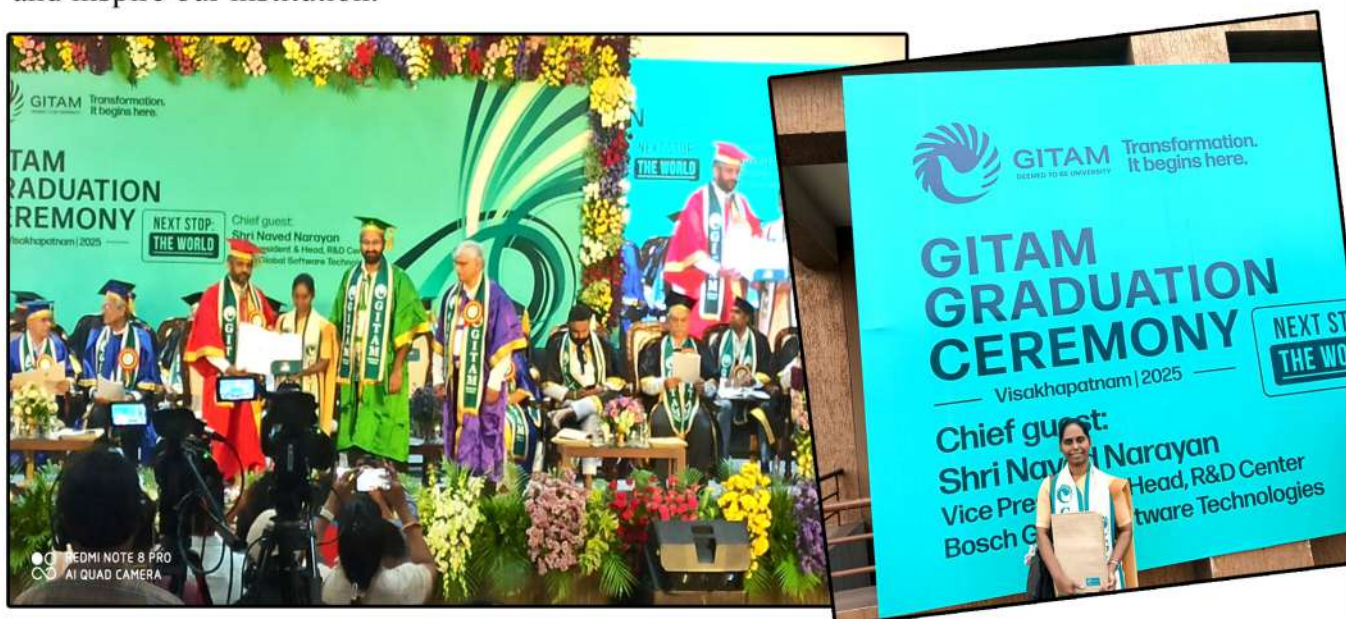
Winning Pitch: III BBA Tops Ad Making

Dr. Jayasri Puli Completes Online Program on HR & AI

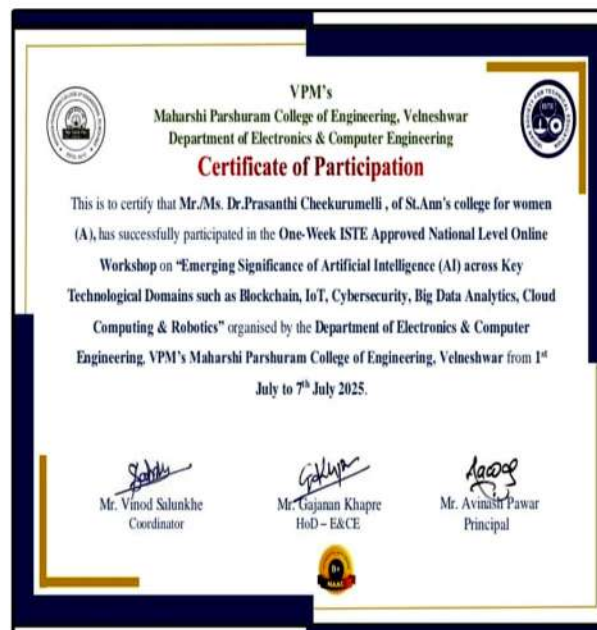
